



Tom Le Feuvre
Director - Global Markets
and International Agreements

Tom was born and educated in Jersey, where his family has always lived. He read History and French at Durham University, gaining a First Class degree with Distinction.

Tom joined Her Majesty's Diplomatic Service in 2008 and initially worked on corporate strategy and Afghanistan-Pakistan relations, based in London. He was deployed overseas to Doha in January 2011 to manage the trade visits to Qatar of the Lord Mayor of London and the UK Prime Minister. He then spent a year on full-time Arabic language training in Jordan, before serving as First Secretary in the UK's Syria Office in Beirut, Lebanon, from 2012-2014.

In this role Tom coordinated UK relations with the Syrian opposition, led a joint diplomatic, humanitarian and military team delivering a €2million programme of conflict resolution, peacebuilding and early recovery activities, and supported the UK Mission to the United Nations in developing UN Security Council resolutions on Syria.

In autumn 2014 Tom returned to London as head of international engagement within the FCO's Ebola Taskforce, providing crisis management expertise and delivering a global lobbying effort that secured over €1billion from the EU and the G20. He then served as the FCO's Head of East Africa, leading the team responsible for UK bilateral relations with Kenya, Ethiopia, Djibouti, Eritrea, Tanzania and Uganda.

Tom returned to Jersey in 2015, where he now serves as Director – Global Markets and International Agreements for the Government of Jersey. In this role Tom is primarily responsible for building Jersey's relations with high-growth, priority Global Markets outside of the EU delivering a programme of engagement that is a vital part of the Island's response to Brexit. He leads Jersey's negotiation of international agreements, including Double Taxation Agreements, Bilateral Investment Treaties, Memoranda of Understanding, and Asset Recovery Agreements. Tom also regularly represents the Island within multinational institutions including the IMF, World Bank, OECD Global Forum, and OECD Inclusive Framework. In 2017 he was elected as Vice-Chair of the OECD's Ad Hoc Group on Country-by-Country Reporting.

Tom retains a keen interest in the voluntary sector having been elected as a trustee of the British Youth Council (2006-2010) and a Director of the Commonwealth Youth Exchange Council (2008-2010). From 2007-2011 he was the UK's Youth Representative to the Commonwealth.
